

A BIBLIOGRAPHICAL ENDNOTE

Before concluding this book, I would like to acknowledge my intellectual debt to a number of works, scholars or institutions which are not cited directly or are only cited to a limited extent in this monograph, but which were nevertheless of great use to me during the first phase of my research. Above all, I would like to stress the usefulness of what I consider to be the best historical handbook on Spanish foreign policy, edited by Juan Carlos Pereira.¹ Also crucial were numerous articles and books published by three of Spain's most interesting research institutes, the *Barcelona Centre for International Affairs* (CIDOB), the *Elcano Royal Institute* and *Fundación Alternativas*. Above all, the yearbooks of CIDOB provide a formidable chronological overview of Spanish and international politics.² Without this tool, the preparation of my interviews would have been much more difficult. In addition, the yearbooks' critical analysis of Spanish foreign policy and international relations, offered by a different scholar each year, stimulated my initial thoughts on this project.³ Several short articles

on all sorts of questions published in the monthly *Ari* journals of the Elcano Royal Institute for the period treated in this book were also helpful as background information. The same applies to a number of policy papers of the *Observatorio de Política Exterior* (OPEX) of the Fundación Alternativas. Finally, the seven volumes published by the Spanish foreign ministry containing Moratinos' official speeches and interventions were of great help in understanding the new direction of Spanish foreign policy, although I only quote this seven-volume publication on limited occasions.⁴
